Brief essays called "Stories of Becoming" act as 23 touchstones throughout the book, "telling the inspiring stories of 24 LGBTQIA+ people whose experiences may bring hope to others," 25 wrote organizers in a news release. 26 Crews is the editor of several bestselling books, including 27 The Wonder of Small Things, The Path to Kindness, and How to 28 Love the World, which has over 100,000 copies in print. He is 29 also the author of a collection of essays, Kindness Will Save the 30 World, available as a hardcover and audiobook. 31 The author of four prize-winning books of poetry, Crews 32 also leads an online writing community called The Monthly Pause 33 (themonthlypause.com).
