- 8 I SERVED ON our local school boards for over 20 years,
- and the best advice I received during that service was from our
- chair: "The people are always right."

Especially when we were divided — that reminder 11 helped us find consensus. 12 We could always agree that the people will tell us what 13 to do. 14 And it's true. 15 And when the people get it wrong, they figure it out and 16 change course. 17 That is the engine of a free republic — power from the 18 bottom up, not the top down. 19 Our founders understood this. 20 They wrote the Declaration of Independence as both a 21 warning and a promise. They declared what was then the most radical idea of its 23 time: "Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just 24 powers from the consent of the governed." 25 Consent. Not force. Not fear. 26 That principle — government by consent — is 27 foundational to our democracy. 28 And today, that foundation is shifting beneath us. 29 30 AUTHORITARIANISM IS on the rise in America, and it has also crossed into fascist actions and rhetoric in our politics. 32 Fascism is a system that concentrates power in one 33 leader or party, punishes dissent, manipulates truth, and divides 34 people through fear and lies — replacing the rule of law with the 35 rule of one man. 36 I am anti-fascism — because being anti-fascism means 37 being for democracy, for the rule of law, for human rights for all, 38 and for our communities. 39 In America we are seeing actions that concentrate power 40 and erode the rule of law — the hallmarks of authoritarian and fascist regimes throughout history: 42 • Elections are being undermined, the Constitution 43 dismissed, and people are dehumanized as "vermin" or "not 44

human."

• The free press is attacked, opponents targeted for 46 prosecution, and retribution through the justice system being 47 attempted. 48 • Those who attacked the U.S. Capitol have been 49 pardoned. 50 • Armed troops are being sent into American cities over 51 the objections of elected governors. 52 • The military is being used against civilians, universities 53 are punished for speech, and wartime powers are invoked to 54 deport people labeled as enemies. 55 • Mass firings of civil servants are ordered in defiance of 56 court rulings, with claims that "the laws don't apply," using crisis 57 as cover to consolidate power. 58 • Government resources — airports, agency websites, federal buildings — are used to broadcast partisan propaganda 60 while the offices that enforce ethics laws are shut down. 61 Qualified and professional military officers are purged, 62 commanders replaced with loyalists, and personal allegiance 63 demanded in place of constitutional obedience. 64 • Military strikes and covert operations are launched 65 without congressional approval, pushing the nation toward war 66 while evidence is withheld and public debate is silenced. Those are not conservative or liberal acts. 68 They are authoritarian. 69 And when they come wrapped in nationalism, 70 dehumanization, and contempt for the rule of law, they are the 71 acts of fascism. 72

Our country is in real trouble.

• Defend local institutions. School boards, Selectboards, 114 libraries, courts — these are where we practice self-government. 115 Show up. Serve. • Do not let your communities unravel. Disagreement is 117 not an emergency. Division is a tactic. Refuse it. 118 • Double down on service. Governing, caretaking, and 119 celebrating are all public service. Coach, volunteer, bring a dish 120 to the potluck. 121 • Celebrate. Remember what we're fighting for. As Anne 122 Lamott says, "Joy is the best revenge." Joy disarms hate. It breaks 123 fear's grip. It keeps communities together. 124 In Vermont, we know how to do this. 125 We fix the culvert, shovel the neighbor's walkway, show 126 up at the potluck fundraiser and also at the budget hearing. 127 We argue — and then we pass the plate and pass the 128 budget. 129 That is not small. That is the foundation. 130 131 THE DECLARATION also says: "Whenever any Form of 132 Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of 133 the People to alter or abolish it." 134 That was a call to revolution then. 135 Today, it's a call to responsibility — to us and to our 136 fellow citizens to change what's destructive through lawful and 137 nonviolent means: by voting, organizing, testifying, litigating, and 138 telling the truth in public. 139 I expect courage from our leaders — and from myself. 140 If you don't hear courage from your elected leader, say 141 so. In our democracy — our republic — silence feeds fear. Your 142 voice is the answer to that fear. This is a very serious time, so we are going to need to 144

Hold fast to one another, my friends. Choose courage 149 over comfort. Choose service over cynicism. Choose joy over 150 fear. That is how free people behave.
