- The Vermont Circus Festival is a regional event with an 8
- international draw framed around circus performances,
- workshops, seminars, and pop-up activities. 10

The seed of the festival began as an annual weekend of 11 circus activities put on by NECCA for the past 15 years. For 2025, 12 "NECCA is rebranding and expanding the experience" to the 13 Vermont Circus Festival, adding guest company performances 14 and a variety of activities beyond the walls of NECCA's trapezium, 15 organizers wrote in a news release. 16 By partnering with local organizations, NECCA is 17 offering many ways to engage with the circus in town. 18 Organizers say the festival will draw roughly 200 19 participants in more than 50 workshops; five performances of 20 three different shows; at least 20 free classes, seminars, exhibits, 21 and discussions, and a "Clown Crawl" at Friday night's Gallery Walk. 23 In addition to workshops in aerials, acrobatics, flying 24 trapeze, and mime, free activities for the community include 25 circus classes at NECCA for youth and adults, "Clowns on Ice" at 26 Nelson Withington Skating Facility (supported by Brattleboro 27 Recreation & Parks), a circus-themed book reading discussion 28 with Brooks Memorial Library, a circus painting exhibit and art 29 discussion featuring longtime circus performer and globally 30 celebrated fine artist and illustrator Karen E. Gersch at 118 Elliot 31 gallery. 32 A "History of Circus in Vermont" seminar will be held 33 with Circus Smirkus Founder Rob Mermin, "Silver Circus" classes 34 for those age 50 and up (sponsored by AARP Vermont), a 35 "Directing for Circus" roundtable with internationally recognized 36 directors (supported by Vermont Humanities Council), figure 37 drawing with acrobat models at The Drawing Studio, and student 38 shows at area retirement homes (sponsored by Ben & Jerry's 39 Foundation). Three shows will grace the stage at NECCA's trapezium 41 featuring guest company Parallel Exit's new show "I'll Take It" on 42 Friday, Nov. 7, an Alumni Cabaret on Saturday, Nov. 8, and a 43 Beta Night Open Stage on Sunday, Nov. 9.
