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6 Artist Jonathan Ryan Storm will lead a walking tour and
7 discussion of his outdoor exhibition, "Time Was a River, Too," at
8 the Brattleboro Museum & Art Center (BMAC) on Saturday, Dec.
9 6, at 3 p.m.

10 The event begins outside the museum, where
participants will view the large reproductions of Storm's artwork

11 installed in the museum's window bays, followed by a discussion
12 indoors.

13 Storm's paintings and textiles feature compositions that,
14 in his words, "don't tell a story, nor are they static—they have a
15 life of their own." Storm said he works intuitively, following his
16 hand through the flow state of painting or the mesmerizing
17 motion of sewing. He added, "I want the work to move—visually,
18 physically, emotionally. It should have its own rhythm." He seeks
19 to create images that he finds compelling and soothing and hopes
20 that viewers experience them in similar fashion.

21 As a person on the autism spectrum, Storm has a self-
22 described "obsession" with rhythm, repetition, and automatic
23 movements.

24 "Time Was a River, Too" is on view outside the museum
25 through April 26, 2026.
