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5 WHEN YOU STEP into the art deco splendor of the Latchis
6 Theatre this weekend, you will be stepping through a portal into
7 a magical world of festivity, joy, fantastical heroism, delectable
8 distortion of reality, and thrilling adventure.

9 The Nutcracker ballet offers a sweet escape into the Land
10 of the Sugar Plum Fairy, where tantalizing treats leap and twirl
11 with rapture to the intoxicating score by Tchaikovsky.

12 But what makes all this fantasy and beauty possible?

13 It may seem everything is just whipped together
14 magically, but this couldn't be further from the truth. The reality is
15 that what you experience from your seat is the culmination of
16 meticulous planning, months of preparation, and countless hours
17 of physical labor.

18 The Brattleboro School of Dance (BSD) is busier than
19 Santa's elves rehearsing dance variations, honing their technique
20 in class, being fitted with bright new costumes, and organizing an
21 army of volunteers.

22 Not to mention building sets, creating a brand new
23 scaffolding and truss structure for backdrops and other theatrical
24 elements, hanging and focusing lights, and numerous other
25 behind-the-scenes aspects that make this show the magical and
26 professional production it is.

27 The beauty of ballet is derived from the look and feel of
28 effortlessness. Poise, control, precision, and grace are the
29 qualities that ballet dancers display on stage to achieve this
30 seemingly magical effect.

31 It takes years and years of training in class and rehearsal
32 to get to this point. Most ballet dancers begin at a very young
33 age, and they dedicate most of their time to develop the
34 herculean strength it takes to become their dream. It is not easy!

37 determination is our featured guest artist this year, Victoria
38 Jaenson, an alum of BSD who will perform the role of Sugar Plum
39 Fairy.

40 Originally from Kampala, Uganda, Jaenson began her
41 formal dance training at the age of 7 at BSD under founder Kathi
42 Keller. She later studied at the Rock School for Dance Education
43 and The Hartt School at the University of Hartford.

44 She went on to dance professionally in companies
45 throughout the U.S., and is currently dancing with Collage Dance
46 Collective in Memphis, Tennessee. When Jaenson graces the
47 stage in her pointe shoes and tutu, you will be watching the
48 product of the years and years of hard work, grueling hours of
49 physical training, psychological and emotional perseverance, and
50 a will of iron.

51 In fact, every dancer you see on stage is showcasing the
52 culmination of their training and passion, in whatever stage of life
53 they are in.

54 You will see popping out from under Mother Ginger's
55 skirt young dancers who have been dancing just a couple years.
56 You will see adult dancers at the Stahlbaum's party in the first act,
57 some of whom are novice dancers, some of whom have danced
58 their whole lives, and most of whom are actual parents of actual
59 dancers in the show.

61 YOU WILL ALSO SEE gracing the stage three high school
62 seniors who have more than a decade of training under their belts
63 — and who have so much more of their dance journey ahead of
64 them.

65 Mariam Abena Diallo will dance the role of The
66 Nutcracker, leading the fight against the Mouse Queen with
67 vivacious strength and heroism and guiding Clara on her dream-
68 like journey.

69 Olive Fleming will be featured as The Snow Queen,
70 whirling and twirling with dazzling grace through the snowy
71 scene of a pine forest.

72 Diana Webb will gracefully and magnanimously weave
73 and wind through the Waltzing Flowers as The Dewdrop Fairy.

74 The dancers you see in this production are giving you,
75 the audience, all of their hard work, passion, and love.

76 That is what makes this show so special.
