6 Friday, January 9, with "Patron Lobkowitz," a concert featuring
7 the music of Beethoven, Haydn, and Förster.

8 The 7 p.m. program spotlights Joseph Franz Maximilian,
9 Seventh Prince of Lobkowitz — a Bohemian aristocrat known for
10 his interest in music and as a patron of Ludwig van Beethoven
11 and other noted masters. Lobkowitz's sister-in-law said of him:

12 “This Prince was as kindhearted as a child and the most foolish
13 music enthusiast. He played music from dusk to dawn and spent
14 a fortune on musicians. Innumerable musicians gathered in his
15 house, whom he treated regally.”

16 Performers are Jesse Irons, Julia Glenn, violins; Anna
17 Griffis, Emily Dahl, violas; and Timothy Merton, Jennifer
18 Morsches, cellos.

19 The Sarasa Ensemble is a collective of international
20 instrumentalists and vocalists who perform classical music
21 spanning the 17th to the 21st centuries, on both period and
22 modern instruments, and bring this music to diverse
23 communities.
